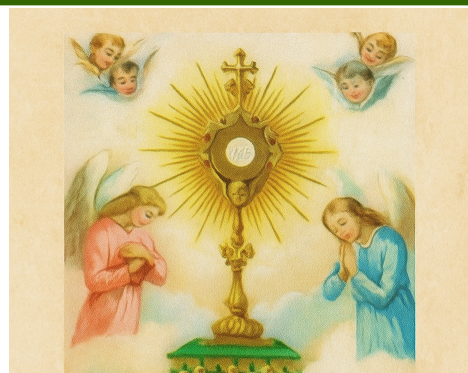

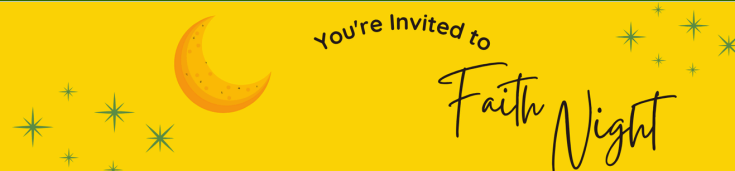

An Update on my Retreat and Pilgrimage in Rome, Giovanni Rotondo, Assisi, Orvieto, Barcelona and Paris

My Dear Parishioners of St. Martin,
Peace be with you all!

I am delighted to be back with you after a truly blessed and spiritually inspiring two-week retreat and pilgrimage. Though I was away, please know that you were constantly in my daily prayers. The Lord was always at my side, guiding my steps throughout this beautiful journey.

The first part of the pilgrimage with my brother priests was centered in **Rome**, where the retreat was a profound success. A highlight was the opportunity to visit and enter the Holy Doors of the Four Major Basilicas. As a priest and your pastor, I carried your needs and intentions with me: At **St. Peter's Basilica**, I prayed for myself and my own intentions in my ministry to you and our community here at St. Martin of Tours. We were privileged enough to celebrate Mass near the Tomb of St Peter.

For all of you, (parish staff, pastoral and finance councils, parish leadership team, different liturgical ministers, all parish organizations, the school, teachers-staff, students, parents and parishioners) I offered my prayers and intentions as I passed through the Holy Doors of the other three great basilicas: **St. John Lateran, St. Paul Outside the Walls, and St. Mary Major**.

On the 18th of Oct, we visited and prayed at the church of St Padre Pio where his uncorrupted body can be seen.

Our pilgrimage also led us to the beautiful hill town of Assisi, where we celebrated Mass and visited the cherished churches of **St. Francis, St. Clare, and the inspiring new saint, St. Carlo Acutis**.

Before my brother priests returned to San Jose on October 22nd, we shared a deeply moving experience by celebrating Mass at the **Cathedral of Orvieto**. This is the sacred place where the altar enshrines the **Eucharistic Miracle of Bolsena**.

A Continued Journey of Faith

After my brother priests departed, I was fortunate to continue my journey, traveling to Barcelona and Paris.

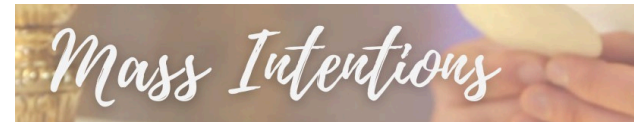
In **Barcelona**, I was overwhelmed by the architectural beauty and spiritual significance of the **Sagrada Familia**, the magnificent **Cathedral of Barcelona**, and the lovely **Sacred Heart Church at Tibidabo**. On my last day in Barcelona, I traveled for one & half hours to this uniquely estranged mountain formation of Monserrat where **Our Lady of Monserrat** is enshrined. I prayed and lighted a candle.

My time in **Paris** was equally moving: On the 27th, I had the privilege of **concelebrating the 12 Noon Mass at Notre Dame Cathedral**—a powerful experience in that historic sanctuary. I also spent time in prayer at the **Sacre Cœur Church**. On my last day, I journeyed to **Normandy**, a 3hr bus ride to make a final ascent and spend the day in prayer at the altar of Mont Saint Michel, on a rocky island dominated by a medieval Benedictine Abbey.

I hope this spiritual experience helps you share in the graces I received. It was a pilgrimage dedicated to renewing my own spirit and to lifting up the needs of our parish.

May the good Lord use this inspiration to help us walk always in His ways all the days of our life.

We will host an In Loving Memory table behind the baptismal font in commemoration of all the Faithful Departed.
