

Rebuilding Our Parish Community: A New Focus on **Middle School Students**

As we continue the important work of rebuilding and renewing our parish community, our next step turns toward a group that is often full of energy, curiosity, and emerging leadership: our middle school students.

Middle school is a pivotal time in a young person's life—a time when friendships deepen, identities take shape, and faith can either flourish or fade. By investing intentionally in this age group, our hope is to build a space where young people—both graduates of St. Martin's and youth from other schools in our surrounding community—can stay connected, feel welcomed, and know they have a home to return to.

Before working in schools, I spent many years serving in parishes designing youth ministry programs, and one truth became abundantly clear: the most effective way to reach young people is through programs that are created and led by their peers or by slightly older students who understand their world. Youth respond deeply to authenticity, and they flourish when they feel ownership over the spaces and communities they belong to.

- A program created by students and during these first few sessions the students who attend will have an opportunity to design their program (including our name, future topics, and what they need from our parish and school community).
- Opportunities for friendship, fun and fellowship
- A sense of belonging that keeps our youth engaged through high school and beyond

Most importantly, we hope to identify and nurture a new generation of youth leaders. These leaders will help us shape programs that truly speak to the needs and interests of their peers. Their voices and creativity are essential as we build a ministry with our youth, not just for them.

Beginning This Advent

Advent is a season of hope, preparation, and new beginnings—making it the perfect time to start this effort. This year, we will launch our middle school youth gatherings on the following dates:

- Tuesday, December 2nd at 6:00 PM
- **Topic:** How do we know God exists?
- Monday, December 8th at 6:00 PM
- **Topic:** If God is real, why does He let bad things happen to good people?
- Monday, December 15th at 6:00 PM
- **Topic:** Does God really hear me when I pray? How do I get God to listen when I need His help?

All gatherings will take place in the school building, and each session will be fun and welcoming, featuring dinner, dessert, and games. These evenings are designed to help our youth build friendships, feel at home, and begin shaping what this ministry will become.

As we light the candles of our Advent wreath, symbolizing Christ's growing light in the world, we pray that this initiative will also bring new light, energy, and joy into our parish community.
