19th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Welcome to the 19th Sunday in Ordinary Time. This week’s readings are all about encounter. Now that you have encountered me through my sharing of my escapades in childhood, upbringing, and vocation, it is time to encounter the most important person of our lives: Jesus, the Son of God.

God never stops seeking after us and finding ways to encounter us. In the first reading, Elijah is given this opportunity but encounters God in an unexpected way. In the Old Testament, when the prophets encountered God, these are known as theophanies. And more often than not, God was associated with strong winds, earthquakes, and fire: think Moses and Mount Sinai. However, in his sovereignty, this time God chose a tiny whispering sound.

In the second reading, St. Paul states that he has sorrow and anguish in his heart due to the Israelites’ stubbornness and unwillingness to accept Jesus as the Messiah despite coming from the same lineage. He does this to remind them and us that faith is needed as a personal response to accepting Jesus as the means of salvation.

The Gospel ties the previous readings together. Here we find Jesus calmly walking on the sea through the storm to reach his disciples. Although initially scared, Peter eventually asks Jesus to command him to walk on the water to the Lord. Jesus answers, “come,” and Peter begins to make his way toward the Lord. However, after focusing on the storm instead of keeping his eyes on the Son of God, Peter begins to sink. But the story doesn’t end there, in desperation Peter yells out for Jesus to save him and the Lord extends his hand to do so. A slight rebuke is given, but better than being left to drown.

What’s the moral of the story? Our God never ceases to try to encounter us. When the trials and tribulations of life rock our boat, call out to the Lord and he will see us through. If we have faith, our Lord will help us conquer the storm and get to him. Even if we lose sight of the Lord and his miracles in our lives causing us to doubt, cry out stronger and the Lord will extend his hand to save us. May our Lord and Mother bless you and keep you through the storms of life.
