




Children's Liturgy of the Word (CLOW)



Formed, Informed, and Transformed: Celebrating Catechetical Sunday

Think back to the first time someone explained the Sign of the Cross to you or patiently taught you the words of the Our Father. Chances are, you're remembering a Catechist. These faithful men and women, often working quietly behind the scenes, play a vital role in passing on the treasure of our Catholic faith. This Sunday, as we celebrate Catechetical Sunday, we give thanks for their service and reflect on how each of us is also called to be a teacher of faith, following the example of the greatest teacher of all, Jesus Christ.

Why Catechetical Sunday Matters

Catechetical Sunday is a reminder that teaching and passing on the faith is central to our Catholic identity. The U.S. Bishops invite parishes to set aside this day to bless and commission Catechists who accompany children, youth, and adults on their journey with Christ. Here at St. Martin of Tours, we honor those who help form us into informed disciples, capable of living out our faith in daily life.

This Sunday's readings point to this responsibility: Amos calls us to live with justice (Amos 8:4-7), St. Paul urges us to pray for all people (1 Timothy 2:1-8), and Jesus reminds us to be faithful stewards of the gifts entrusted to us (Luke 16:1-13). Our Catechists embody these readings by guiding us to recognize God's gifts and live as His disciples.

The Role of Catechists and the Pastoral Plan

The Diocese of San Jose's Pastoral Plan calls us to invigorate faith formation and create "missionary disciples." Catechists are essential to this mission. They help foster prayer, welcome newcomers through OCIA, strengthen small faith groups, and prepare us for the sacraments. Through their dedication, they help us not only learn about God but encounter Him in a way that transforms our lives.
