My Shunem Experience at St Martin of
Tours, San Jose

Fr. Tony



The encounter between the Prophet Elisha and the influential woman at **Shunem**, recalled in the First reading for this weekend 1kings 4:8 describes my experience at St Martin of Tours in the last two years of my ministry here at the Parish. Someone may be tempted to say I chose the reading at Mass for this weekend, but I did not. It’s a pure coincidence that the readings connect very well with me as I say goodbye to the community.

I have been a priest for only five years, but in these years, all the families I have visited or have gone out to dinner with, the invitation came from the wife. Even as a seminarian, my experience was the same, that the woman of the house is always the one taking the initiative to invite the priest or seminarian to come over to the house for dinner on behalf of the family. Our first reading gives the details of what the woman did: she frequently offered dinner to the Prophet Elisha but then took it further, she requested that a room be given to Elisha in their house so he could sleep over and feel more comfortable. The details given are amazing: the room was furnished with a bed, table, chair and lamp. The reason for such details is simple, the intention of the scripture writer is to say that Elisha was truly cared for. He enjoyed the hospitality of that family initiated by the woman.

For us Christians, hospitality is an expression of the love of neighbor in practical terms. Several passages in scripture encourage us to be hospitable, for in doing so, some entertained Angels. This community has shown me great hospitality. From my arrival to this day, I have experienced the love of God in this community. It is often said that wherever there is peace, joy, love and happiness, the Spirit of God is present there, no one will deny the presence of all these fruits of the Holy Spirit within our community.

As I conclude my assignment here, I want to express my gratitude to each member of this community. Thank you to our Pastor, Fr Celso, thank you to all the parishioners, Parish staff, students, staff and faculty at our school, thank you for all your support and prayers over the years. Thank you to all the volunteers in our parish who do so much work to make the life of the priests a little easier and help the parish run smoothly. Jesus says in this weekend’s Gospel: “Whoever receives a prophet because he is a prophet will receive a prophet’s reward.” For receiving me with such wonderful hospitality, may you all receive a prophet’s reward. Thank you and goodbye: “Gracias y adios.”
