

God’s Gift of Humility and Love

My Dear Parishioners,

Greetings of Peace and Joy this Christmas!

Like many of you, when I was a child, Christmas was always a season of bright joy. My heart would lift seeing the colorful decorations hanging in our homes, on the streets, in the parks, and in our churches. Yet, I confess, my appreciation was often limited to the things I could see and receive. Christmas was truly meaningful and joyful only if I got what I wanted. My early understanding of the season was perhaps too materialistic.

My comprehension of Christmas deepened when I entered the seminary and was nurtured further when I became a priest. I realized that the true beauty and meaning of Christmas does not come from my own desires or efforts, but it comes solely from the One who started Christmas: God the Father.

The first Christmas happened because God the Father showed His infinite love and immense humility for us. He sent His beloved Son, Jesus Christ, to empty Himself—to step down from heavenly glory—to be born in a humble manger and dwell among us. This act reveals the profound reason for His coming: pure, selfless love.

If Christmas is the season of giving, it is God who first gave His most precious Son. Jesus is His gift to us.

Now I realize that when Christmas arrives, you and I have already received the most valuable gift in the universe: Jesus Himself.

Receiving this gift is wonderful, but the joy should not end there. We are called to be like a vessel: we must pour out the content—God’s love and humility—to others so that we can continue to receive His grace.

We are not just recipients; we are intended to be instruments of God’s gift and agents of sharing His love with the world. This is the ultimate meaning of His coming into the world: We receive God’s love so that we may give it away.

May the humble love of the Christ Child fill your hearts and homes with true and lasting joy this Christmas Day.
