The Water that Flows from the Temple

If anyone sees water flowing from beneath our Church building and reports that to either Fr Celso or myself, we would definitely panic. Emergencies like this make pastors worry because of the inconveniences and the cost implications that come with them. This is the kind of imagery that we are presented with in the first reading this weekend from the book of the Prophet Ezekiel 47. Ezekiel saw water flowing from the temple which is God’s dwelling place. Wherever this water flows, all sorts of living creatures shall multiply. This water brings about an abundance of fish. When this water flows into the sea, it makes the sea water fresh. The plants that are nourished by this water shall bear fresh fruit which will serve as food and their leaves will serve as medicine.

This is beautiful depiction of what the grace of God that flows from the Church makes the world look like. The Church is God’s dwelling place and his graces flow from it to nourish the world so that the recipients of God’s grace will bear so much fruit in the world. This is the very reason we are invited to continue doing outreach as a Church so that many people will come to discover this river that empties itself into the world for its nourishment. Each and everyone of us is encouraged to continue inviting others to attend Mass where the wellspring of graces flow into our souls. Outreach is one of the priorities of the Pastoral Plan and this first reading this weekend highlights that clearly.

Opportunities like retreats, pilgrimages, Cursillo, Alpha, OCIA and a whole lot of other opportunities are made available to us so that God’s graces may touch us through them. Our Parish Faith Night this Wednesday November 12 from 6pm is another wonderful opportunity to experience this “water flowing from the temple to refresh our souls”. Fr Brendan who is a wonderful speaker and Pastor of St Simon in Los Altos will be speaking to us on: Tiny Habits of Prayer. All are invited to come and just enjoy this evening of community building and faith sharing as a parish. May we all take advantage of moments of grace the Lord provides to nourish us his people.
